

### THE PARTS OF YOUR UKULELE



### 1. HOW TO TUNE YOUR UKULELE

**CONGRATULATIONS!** You are starting down a lifelong, rewarding journey of playing in tune!

- The strings on your new ukulele need to be stretched before tuning.
- You will need to tune your uke each time you play.
- Place your hand on the bridge and lightly tug on the strings, pulling them away from the face of the ukulele. Do this to each string a few times during the tuning process.
- Sound each string individually. The string name will appear on the display.
- The most common ukulele tuning is G-C-E-A.
- When the needle is in the middle and the letter turns GREEN, the string is in tune. WHITE is out of tune.

#### HOW TO KNOW IF YOU ARE GETTING CLOSE TO BEING IN TUNE:

• If you are trying to tune to G and the tuner reads to the left of center, you are flat and will need to tighten the tuner. If the tuner reads right of center, you are sharp and will need to loosen your tuner. Be careful not to over tighten your string or it will break.


## 2. HOW TO HOLD YOUR UKULELE

- · Hold the ukulele in your left hand.
- Looking down at the ukulele, the G String (4th string) is up and the A String (1st string) is down.
- The neck should be cradled in you left hand with your thumb behind the neck and your fingers on the front side of the neck.
- Cradle the body in your right arm with your forearm pressing it to your body.
- The ukulele will be held high on your body in the crook of your elbow.
- Your right hand points towards the neck of the ukulele.



## 3. HOW TO STRUM YOUR UKULELE

- To strum, make a loose fist with your index finger extended.
- Hold your fist in the center of your chest pointing left.
- Brush the fingernail of your index finger down across the strings towards the floor.
- Use the tip of your finger and nail to strum on the way up.
- Practice strumming down-down-down-down, initially.



## 4. HOW TO MAKE CHORDS

- Each of the frets on the ukulele, the strings, and your fingers are given a number.
- The fret closest to the headstock of the ukulele is the 1st fret. As you move up the neck towards the sound hole, the fret under the 1st fret is the 2nd fret, and so on.
- Please reference the chart below for visual.


#### WHEN FORMING A C CHORD USING THE FINGER CHART:

• Press your 3rd fingertip on the first string at the 3rd fret.

#### WHEN FORMING AN Am CHORD USING THE FINGER CHART:

• Press your 3rd fingertip on the fourth string at the 2nd fret.

NOTE: If you press too hard or not hard enough on the string, it can cause unwanted buzzing.



## 5. HOW TO PLAY SONGS


- Practice forming chords while strumming very slowly.
- Continue to practice chord changes until you can speed up and become fluid.

#### CHORDS IN THE KEY OF G














## HOUSE OF THE RISING SUN


